Duties & Responsibilities:

The Humane Education Department conducts Animal Camp in the summertime, an intensive learning experience for 9-12 year-olds. This internship is ideal for someone who likes children and animals and wants to make a difference in the community. The Youth Education Intern will assist the Humane Educator in setting up the room each camp day, facilitating activities, and working with Education Volunteers to provide general supervision. Animal Camp is a unique opportunity to learn more about domestic and wild animals. The Intern will have an opportunity to develop skills relevant to youth counseling and teaching.

Training:

Prior experience with elementary school-aged children preferred. Pre-camp briefing and on-the-job training is provided.
